#### What we do

#### The LSC:

- Provides legal aid, legal advice and information to people with legal problems in England and Wales. This enables people to protect their fundamental rights and receive a fair hearing
- Facilitates access to the court process to resolve disputes
- Addresses problems which contribute to social exclusion or which can help move people out of social exclusion


#### Our services


- A network of organisations (solicitors and nfps)
  who provide advice and representation on family
  and SWL problems (debt, housing, welfare
  benefits, education and community care)
- In 2006/07, we helped more than 800 000 people
- £800 million spent annually
- Traditionally providers have set up where it suited them rather than where clients need access to services

#### Access

- We now specify where we want to purchase services for clients
- KPI on access 100% of clients within 45 min travel time from a family provider and 97% with 45 mins of a SWL provider
- Travel time data used to help target contracting activity alongside our needs analysis and population density models.



•KPI Statistics




•GIS Analysis – Spatial Locations of LSOA areas Outside of 45 minute access






### Access statistics



- Access time varies by category of law
- Family providers 99.6%
- < 45 minutes away
- Housing **81%**
- < 45 minutes away
- Any Civil **99.7%**


LSOAs outside of the 45min analysis (Community Care)

- Analysis by SWL category (Community Care).
- "No data" areas
- Areas of concern are highlighted for Policy makers

## **GIS** Analysis



- LSOA regions outside of the 45 minute commute to the nearest Debt provider.
- Legal Services
   Research Centre –
   Justiciable needs model
- Demographic data (% of people likely to have a money problem in that LSOA)

#### Issues for the future

- There is no one measure of access it is complex and not limited to what can be measured
- It is how the data is used that counts keep going back to what you are trying to achieve and use it as a measurement
- Practical limitations to the data and how it can be used
- LSOA population centroid is <u>only a model</u> of the real population
